## Harley-Davidson® Softail Deuce 2000-2007

Solo and Passenger Seat

Hardware: Solo seat: Passenger seat:

> Stock side Allen bolts x 2 Stock rear bracket

> > 10/32 x 5/8" screws x 2

Tools needed: Phillips screwdriver

SAE Allen wrenches

#### Removal of Stock Seat:

- 1. Remove the rear fender screw.
- 2. Remove handstrap if present.
- 3. Lift the stock seat up and back to remove from motorcycle.



Note: Mustang solos and passenger seats will not work with stock seats.

#### **Installation of Mustang Seat:**

- 1. Locate the Allen bolts securing the front of the struts and remove.
- 2. Remove the spacer washers from between the struts and the frame.



- 3. Insert the seat's nose bracket into the frame mount behind the gas tank.
- 4. Lower and align the seat's side brackets between the struts and the frame.
- 5. Re-insert the stock Allen bolts and tighten securely.
- 6. If installing passenger seat, remove the stock rear bracket from the stock seat and mount it to the back of the Mustang passenger seat with the supplied  $10/32 \times 5/8$ " screws.





- 7. Slide the front passenger seat bracket into the receiver under the back of the Mustang solo as far as possible.
- 8. Align rear bracket with fender nut and secure with stock screw.
