

You must know how to remove and replace your stock exhaust in order to install this product otherwise have it installed by a profession mechanic. Keep all stock parts from your existing system as some components may be necessary to install your new Yoshimura exhaust depending on the application.			
	Read through all instructions before beginning installation. Exhaust system can be extremely hot. Let motorcycle cool down before beginn installation. Always wear hand and eye protection and take precautionary measures to avoid injury.

-TOOLS REQUIRED-

Metric Socket Set • Combination Wrench Set • Torque Wrench • Metric Allen Wrench Set

-REMOVAL-

- 1. Removing the number plate, side cover, and mud guard.
 - a) Remove the left and right number plate.
 - b) Remove the left and right side airbox covers.
 - c) Remove mud guard.
- 2. Removing the muffler.
 - a) Loosen right muffler exhaust clamp.
 - b) While securely supporting the right muffler, remove muffler mount bolt and carefully remove right side muffler.
 - c) Loosen the exhaust clamp on tailpipe.
 - d) Remove chassis mount bolt securing tailpipe assembly to subframe.
 - e) While securely supporting the left muffler, remove muffler mount bolt and carefully remove left muffler and tailpipe assembly.
 - f) Remove the (2) header nuts and carefully remove header.

-INSTALLATION-

- 1. Installing the header.
 - a) Install Yoshimura header using stock nuts. Do not torque header nuts at this time. (NOTE: For ease of installation, install exhaust springs onto flange before installing.) (NOTE 2: It is recommended that you replace the exhaust port gasket.)
- 2. Installing the muffler tailpipe assembly.
 - a) Carefully install Yoshimura midpipe by sliding onto Yoshimura header.
 - b) Bolt the tailpipe to chassis mount using the stock bolt and shim. Be sure to install stock shim between subframe and tailpipe chassis mount. Start threads by hand to prevent cross-threading.
 - c) Install left and right muffler onto midpipe outlets using stock muffler mount bolts.
 - d) Torque muffler mount bolts and tailpipe chassis mount bolt to 19lb-ft (26Nm, 2.6kg-m)
 - e) Torque header nuts to 15lb-ft (21Nm, 2.0kg-m)
 - f) Install the (3) exhaust springs on the flange to the header. See diagram for proper orientation and order of hardware.
 - g) Install the (2) muffler springs. See diagram for proper orientation and order of hardware.
 - h) Install provided medium exhaust spring on tailpipe-header joint. See diagram for proper orientation and order of hardware.
- 3. Reinstall number plate, side cover, and mud guard.
 - a) Re-install left and right side number plate.
 - b) Re-install left and right side airbox covers.
 - c) Re-install mud guard.
 - Fitment check and Notes.

- a) Before starting motorcycle, check for proper clearance between new exhaust system and rear suspension (i.e. tire, swing-arm, brake, rear shock, engine, and etc.) If any problem is found, please carefully follow through the installation steps again. If problem still persists, please call Yoshimura Tech Department at (800) 634-9166 / in CA (909) 628-4722.
- b) It is recommended that the muffler and tailpipe be wiped down with rubbing alcohol to remove oil and fingerprints. This will help prevent tarnishing of the finish after the exhaust is heated up.
- c) NOTE: After starting motorcycle, it is normal for new exhaust system and muffler to emit smoke until oil residue burns off.

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
