

NOTE: IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, IT IS ILLEGAL TO MODIFY THE EMISSION CONTROL SYSTEM, WHICH INCLUDES THE CARBURETORS OF ANY VEHICLE.

Installation Procedures:

Caution: Exhaust system can be extremely hot. Let motorcycle cool down before beginning installation.

Note: Read through all instructions before beginning installation.

Tools Needed:

Metric Socket Set Metric Combination Set Ratchet and Extension #3 Phillips Screwdriver Torque Wrench Allen Key Set

Installation Steps:

- 1 Loosen and raise rear fenders and unbolt and remove stock muffler (see Fig. 1 for bolt locations).
- 2 Loosen stock header bolts.
- 3 Install supplied rubber grommets into aluminum muffler mounting brackets. Install aluminum inserts into rubber grommets (make sure shoulder of aluminum insert faces toward the frame, see Fig. 2).
- 4 Slide supplied exhaust clamp over the inlet of the Yoshimura tailpipe and install Yoshimura tailpipe and muffler onto stock header.


NOTE: Stock gasket between header and tailpipe is NOT used with Yoshimura slip-on system.

- 5 Mount muffler to stock muffler mounting locations using supplied bolts, washers, and aluminum spacers (see Parts Diagram on Page 3).
- 6 Tighten header bolts to 16.5 lb-ft (23 N-m).
- 6 Torque exhaust clamp to 7 lb ft (10 N-m).
- 7 Torque muffler mounting bolts to 16.5 lb-ft (23 N-m).
- 8 Tighten rear fender bolts.
- 9 Install Yoshimura heatshield onto Yoshimura tailpipe using supplied bolts.
- 10 It is recommended that the slip-on system be wiped down with rubbing alcohol to remove oil and fingerprints. This will help prevent tarnishing of the finish after the exhaust is heated up.
- 11 Before starting engine check for proper clearance between new exhaust system and chassis body work or any moving parts. (i.e. rear brake, frame, tire, bodywork etc.) If any problem is found, please carefully follow through the installation steps again. If problem still persists, please call Yoshimura technical department at (800)634-9166, in CA (909)628-4722.

NOTE: After starting motorcycle, it is normal for new exhaust system and muffler to emit smoke until oil residue burns off.




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






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Spark Arrester Cleaning Information



Parts Diagram

Caution: Muffler can be extremely hot. Let muffler cool down before removing spark arrester.

Note: Read through all instructions before beginning disassembly.

Tools Needed:

4mm Allen Key Wire Brush Pair of Gloves Safety Glasses

Cleaning Steps:

- 1 Using a 4mm Allen key, remove the bolt that secures the aluminum ring and spark arrester to the muffler (see Parts Diagram for location).
- 2 Remove the spark arrester from the muffler.

3 Using a wire brush, remove carbon deposits from spark arrester screen. Inspect the screen for excessive wear or damage. If spark arrester is excessively worn or damaged, the spark arrester must be replaced. Cleaning and inspection should be performed at the same time as muffler repacking. Repacking is recommended every 8-10 hours of riding or 2 motos, whichever comes first.

CAUTION: Gloves and safety glasses should be worn while cleaning spark arrester.

4 Re-install spark arrester and aluminum ring. Torque the spark arrester securing bolt to 1.0 kg-m (7.3 lb-ft).

NOTE: It is recommended that a low strength "Loc-tite" is used on the spark arrester securing bolt.
